Summary: (machine translated) Discontinuous, but beautiful lime canyon; clean cold water; well equipped; short access; 2 entry points; several emergency exits in the upper part, more difficult towards the bottom; possible rockfall from hiking trail; most sunlight in the afternoon; several smaller tributaries; some logs; be careful with jumps/slides because of shallow ; info at "Outdoorfriends" (Roland Hatzenbichler).		
Attention!!! New siphon in the upper part. Currently bypassable with fixed ropes (April 2021).		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) From Sbg.-Süd take the Westautobahn to Mondsee. Follow the main road (Romantikstraße) in the direction of St. Gilgen. After the village of Scharfling, turn left towards Unterach. Through the tunnel and always along Mondsee (L217) to the next junction. Turn right here towards Unterach am Attersee (B151). After approx. 2km, turn right towards Burgau/Weißenbach am Attersee (B152). Follow the road alongside the Attersee to the former Jägerwirt inn (approx. 2.5 km). Get a parking space for €5 from the vending machine (= bottle of mineral water and parking ticket €5). If full or closed, follow the road and look for a parking space on the shore		
Approach: (machine translated) From the parking lot (480m) next to the Jägerwirt, follow the hiking signs behind the inn, marked "zur Bruggrabenklamm" or "zur Eisenau" (trail 26). At the height of the statue of St. Mary, the water level can be checked at the exit at approx. 500m. Then follow the hiking trail orographically left next to the canyon for approx. 20 minutes up to the 1st entry point after the iron bridge that leads over the stream (approx. 610m). For the upper entry, follow the path over 2 wooden bridges and past the Magdalenenquelle (fountain). After a short time you will come to a signpost. Follow path 26 right towards Eisenau. After the wooden footbridge, the trail climbs again briefly to a small wooden bridge. This is the upper entry point (approx. 670m & approx. 40min)		

Tour: (machine translated)

Shortly after the upper entry at approx. 670m there is a small slide and a 10m abseil in the water course. This is followed by a downclimb and walking passages with a short narrow part. After a while there is another 10m abseil and then a 15m abseil in the water course. This is followed by several beautiful small pools, washouts and a walking passage to the iron bridge (lower entry). The 2nd section is often used commercially and is therefore well equipped. From the bridge there is another walk and downclimb before you reach the first larger step. Here you can usually descend using fixed ropes. Even at higher water levels, there are often opportunities to rappel outside the water flow, but the canyon should not be underestimated, as the narrow sections in particular can be very dangerous. The highlight towards the exit is a beautiful 20m waterfall. Here you have the option to rappel left in the water or right out of the water. The best way to reach the belay is via a traverse rope (anchors for the cable car are also available below!). Then you are in the middle of high gorge walls. A few smaller steps (and a 3m jump) follow until the exit at approx. 500m

Return: (machine translated)

On the left side of the stream, follow the hiking trail to the parking lot.
