We are located in Ainsa (N260), we will take the A138 towards France through the Bielsa tunnel. After a few kilometers we will pass through Labuerda and at pk57 we arrive at Escalona. We will continue towards France passing through Lafortunada until the detour to the valley of Chistau/Gistaín (A2609).

We will go along this road until the detour to Saravillo/Ibon de Plan, we will go up to the village until the barrier where we will have to pay the 3€ to continue along the track of Ibon de Plan or Basa de Mora, about 4kms later we will cross the ravine. We park here

This path will make us cross another rocky area and a forest before taking us to the riverbed again. We will continue climbing another half hour to overcome a forest and where two small valleys meet, we will enter the riverbed.

We will continue along the riverbed up to the track


