Lime canyon below an automatic catchment, not without danger, you should call the Sarganserland power station before you go in, but they can't control it.

**Hydrology:** (machine translated)

Attention, AUTOMATIC water inlet at the beginning of the lower part of the Tersol torrent. Water jet under the inlet, vertical course.

If you really want to go down it, you should only go when the current of the Tersol allows you to go down the upper part, i.e. in September or October.

**Access:** (machine translated)

Take the road through the Tamina valley up to Gigerwald.

**Approach:** (machine translated)

Hiking trail as on the Tersolbach.

**Tour:** (machine translated)

Attention, automatic water extraction at the lower part of the Tersol stream. This water intake takes all the water from the Tersol stream so that the canyon downstream is dry or is only fed by lateral inflows.

This water intake is automatic, there is a unclogging system that opens the water intake to clean it. This system is AUTOMATIC, unclogging occurs when the water inlet is too clogged with sand, gravel, stones, wood, etc.

When the water intake is opened, the entire volume of water from the Tersol stream, together with the debris clogging the water intake and the water in the water intake, flows into the lower part and forms an extremely dangerous wave.

This automatic unclogging system cannot be switched off remotely, so calling the operator of this water intake does not provide any additional safety.

It is therefore strongly recommended not to enter this part of the Tersol canyon.

Deep canyon with little water (below the inlet) and some abseiling points.
