Its toponymy responds to the name of the area and the Piedras del Diablillo stream. Generally dry canyon except after heavy rains, with relatively simple rappels of up to 36m that we can use to start.

Comfortable access by track and similar return although it is possible to be shortened something atrochando.

After the last rapel, on the left there is a path with a lot of loose, somewhat exposed aculeus that in a moment leaves us on the track, we take it to the left towards the Leres ravine, soon we will cross it, just here we could make an atroche to the top of the track, if not we will follow it always ascending and to the left to go to stop at the place where we left the vehicle.

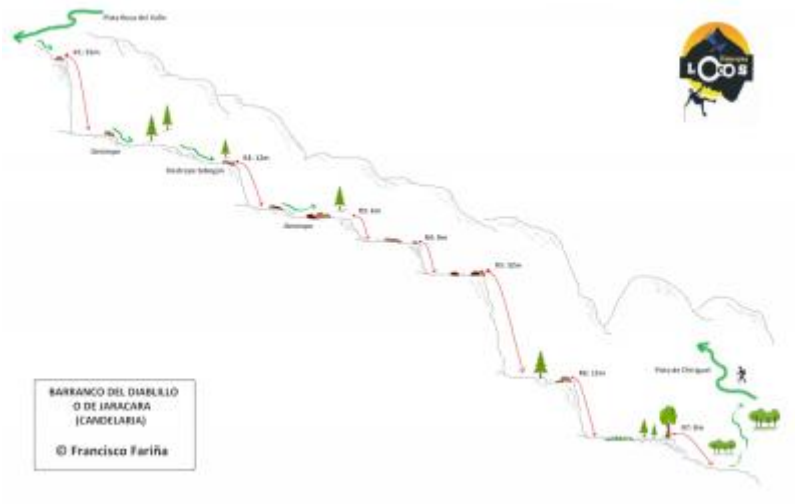
