Summary: (machine translated) Long, mostly uninteresting canyon except for a short gorge section. Once done, seen, done, not again. The path between exit and entry is very long and not very appealing.		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) A93 to Oberaudorf, then to Erl, then up Erler Berg to the bridge over the stream (entry). OR Mühlgraben to the bridge over the stream in Oberweidau (exit).		
Approach: (machine translated) Across the meadows west of the canyon or via Erler-Berg-Strasse. The upper weir and the sections leading to it can be overcome by climbing and balancing, which is not without danger (quite nice...), but you can also simply walk around it. A few fun steel ladders make the way up easier.		
Tour: (machine translated) The short gorge section about 15 minutes after the entry is really beautiful. After that, the route continues very steadily in a V-shaped valley. At the exit there are two lakes, each with weirs. We skipped the second part of about half the route (~2km) to the reservoirs out of boredom, so no description can be given for this part. However, you can look in from above and it doesn't look very interesting (please correct if necessary as soon as you've been there!). The access or the way back is very long, depending on where you put the car. It is very advantageous to have a driver or two cars when walking the entire route. We recommend an exit after the three cascading steps that come after the gorge. After that there is nothing interesting for a very long time.		
Return: (machine translated) Across the meadows west of the canyon or via Erler-Berg-Strasse. The upper weir and the routes to it can be overcome by climbing and balancing (quite nice...), but you can also simply walk around the outside or rappel (steel railings etc.). A few steel ladders make the way up easier.

We entered via the side entry with rope traverse and exited shortly before the last high one on the right, as access to the dam wall was blocked and the owner of the power station forbids access to the waterfall. The rock was relatively slippery and the jumps at the flying fox and shortly afterwards at the slide were deep. The jumps at the dam were all covered with gravel. (machine translated)
