Long hiking canyon with some slides and jumps in a very secluded location. Not equipped. The canyon is located entirely in the Kalkalpen National Park (access restrictions?)

**Access:** (machine translated)

In Unterlaussa turn off the main road towards 'Knappenhaus', pass here and drive over the Mooshöhe to the parking lot in the Weisswassertal (last sand road)

**Approach:** (machine translated)

Follow the forest road to the "Weisswasser" bivouac site. From there, follow the marked forest road towards Blahbergalm. Once at the saddle, follow the already heavily overgrown forest road southwards into the Haselbach valley. Entry at the bridge over the stream.

If you only want to walk the lower part, follow the forest road that leads from the exit of the Haselbach gorge eastwards up to its exit. From there, descend pathless into the canyon, which you reach in the area of an old hermitage.

**Tour:** (machine translated)

Forest gorge with short narrow sections. Many low drops that have to be jumped or downclimbed. There were no abseiling points in 2004. After the hermitage, the canyon narrows and two slightly higher canyons had to be rappelled (tree rappels). After the second drop there is a karst spring from a cave (Goldloch) with lots of water.
