Gear: Ropes: 1x50m+1x40m crampons, ice screws,		
Summary: (machine translated) Alpine rappel canyon, in earlier years usually covered by avalanche debris all year round. Finding the entry is not easy. Completely different character to the lower parts.		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) Either from Mittenwald or from Seefeld to the Leutasch valley. Between Lochlehn and Reindlau is the Hotel Hubertushof. Here we park our car at a suitable place.		
Approach: (machine translated) We follow the signposted path, later path, in the direction of Meilerhütte. After some time we pass a spring and after about 40 min. we reach the high valley , at the lower exit of which we enter the lower gorge section of the Berglein valley. Continuing on the path we see the final passage of the upper part. It now goes steeply uphill in many hairpin bends. After a haipin bend the path starts to climb again in hairpin bends. We come to a gravel creek bed and see on the right a latschenfreie Fläche (GPS: N 47' 24' 41.97 / E 11' 9' 29.95). We cross the dry streambed, climb about 5m (height) to the ridge on the other side of the slope (1590m alt.) and then traverse the open area slightly descending. In doing so, we keep towards a clear gulch in the right part of the mountain pine belt. Here again a recognizable track leads in northern direction towards the canyon rim. We ignore tracks branching off to the right. At GPS: N 47' 24' 47.75 / E 11' 9' 26.84 it is reached. At the edge of the canyon we see a thick root, where we can rappel down into the canyon, which is still dry.		
Tour: (machine translated) The initially open canyon narrows continuously. The canyon walls become higher. The higher rappels are found in this first third. A number of smaller rappels and small descents follow. These are partly unpleasant, because the channel is very slippery. Sometimes anchors are missing. After the final passage, which can be seen in the access, one stands again in the high valley above the lower part of the canyons.		
Return: (machine translated) Either you continue the tour in the lower part of the canyon (info see there) or you change to the right out onto the access path and follow it down to the car.

Finding the entry point is not entirely obvious. We fought our way through the mountain pines and rappelled into the still dry gravel gully at a suitable point. The first half of the upper section is rather sparsely equipped. If you have problems with downclimbing, you should take some climbing gear with you. The second part of the upper section is very good and also equipped with glued anchors (there is probably an intermediate entry point here). The lower part is also superiore equipped. Two people can complete the upper and lower sections in just under 3 hours (machine translated)
