Summary: (machine translated)

Tour with small rappels, jumps and slides, but also with a lot of dead wood, especially in the lower part of the canyon.

Hydrology: (machine translated)

Normally a tour with a rather low water flow. In the lower part of the canyon, several small canyons flow into our canyon. Most of the water is introduced by the last large waterfall, just before the exit of the tour. The catchment area cannot be determined exactly, but is estimated to be relatively large.

Access: (machine translated)

We drive from Walchsee or Niederndorf in the direction of Rettenschöss, past the address Schwaigs 28, 6344 Schwaigs, until we arrive at the Kitzbichl hiking parking lot. Here you have to buy a parking ticket of 3,- Euro per day (as of August 2024).

Approach: (machine translated)

We follow the hiking trail to the Aufinger Alm, past the barrier. After two narrow bends, we cross a cattle grid. After the gate, we follow the path branching off to the left, which we leave after the first bend downhill towards the forest. From here we look for a path straight down into the stream.

Tour: (machine translated)

This is a tour with several rappels at low altitudes up to a maximum of 9 meters. There are also some jumps and slides in the upper part of the canyon, but these are either blocked by gravel or trees (as of August 2024). In the lower part of the canyon, you currently have to fight your way through a lot of dead wood that has fallen into the stream. It is advisable to leave the tour early via the emergency exit on the left-hand side.

Return: (machine translated)

If you choose the emergency exit option, simply follow the forest path back to the parking lot. If you go all the way to the exit, shortly after the large waterfall that flows into ours from the right, turn left and follow the hiking trail past a bench and a memorial to the road. You can either take the previously positioned vehicle to the top or walk along the road to the parking lot.
