Alpine canyon, vertical and wild, with almost 20 natural rappels to descend its 400m of vertical drop, therefore it will require a good physical and technical level. Caution with the friction and rope recoveries. To take into account its cold waters.

**Hydrology:** (machine translated)

Possible as it is an open alpine canyon. Some areas will not be easy to escape because of the environment.

**Access:** (machine translated)

We have to go to the tunnel of Bielsa, for it we arrive to Ainsa and take the A138 towards France or from France by the D929 going up by St Lary-Soulan. Just below the Bielsa tunnel at pk 90.1 the road passes an anti-avalanche tunnel and a bridge crosses the stream of Pinarra. We parked

**Approach:** (machine translated)

Access to Bco Pinarra and Salcorz

Next to the anti-avalanche tunnel we have the access to the PR HU181 trail that goes up to Ibón de Salcorz.

Halfway, about 1700m, the trail approaches the ravine and we will see a path that goes to it, it is a way to access the middle of the ravine or an escape in case of need.

We will continue climbing up to 2000m where the trail crosses the stream, access point.

**Tour:** (machine translated)

Alpine canyon, quite loose shale (be careful with the landslides) and very cold water. The rappels are from trees so we must be equipped with material just in case.

Keep in mind, the highest rappel, 47m, is the most vertical and we can find a good jet falling on us with force. Caution!

**Return:** (machine translated)

The last rappel leaves us in the anti-avalanche tunnel, we only have to go down to the road.


