Summary: (machine translated)

Also known as Los Corners, is an alpine canyon, little known, with adventure facilities but that can give us a good time both for its views and its configuration in granite. The end of spring and the beginning of autumn are the best times to ensure a good flow.

To take into account its long approach and the hardness of a descent of this type.

Hydrology: (machine translated)

Yes, although not easy due to the orography of the area to find a way out on the hillside.

Access: (machine translated)

We have to go to the tunnel of Bielsa, for it we arrive to Ainsa and take the A138 towards France or from France by the D929 going up by St Lary-Soulan. At km 88.5 we have the bridge over the river Barrosa, we can park here. If we have 4x4 we can take the track of Barrosa and go up to where we arrive.

Approach: (machine translated)

We will follow the trail to the Barrosa refuge, once here we will go up the path that goes to the cirque and rises above the waterfalls or jumps of Barrosa, in the direction of the port.

Once past the waterfalls, at an altitude of about 2150m the trail turns NW, at this point we leave the trail to go east to overcome the watershed. Just on the other side we have a watercourse under the peak of Barrosa that goes to the SE. This is our descent.

Tour: (machine translated)

Succession of alpine waterfalls, granitic and with cold water. In summer we will hardly get wet, unless we want to.

Return: (machine translated)

At the end of the descent we will continue descending to the river, cross it and go back to the access trail.
