**Summary:** (machine translated)

Interesting little known canyon in the Pas area, its first open part with a multitude of rappels is the most remarkable. The bad part is that from the middle of the canyon there is a lot of vegetation that tarnishes the descent.

**Hydrology:** (machine translated)

Yes, in most of the route, the bad part is the walk on the slopes until you find a path/track.

**Access:** (machine translated)

As to go to a classic like Ajan, we must get to Vega de Pas. From the N623 in Entrambasmestas take the CA263. At p.k. 7,5 we have the detour to the right to San Pedro del Romeral (at 9km) by the CA632. Almost after 7 kms, just before finishing the ascent to San Pedro, the turning to Bustaleguín comes out on the left, it is two kilometers of cemented track up to the mountain divide, at this point we could park, we have the GR back here or continue to the right up to a water reservoir.

**Approach:** (machine translated)

From the reservoir there is a track to your left, from here it is easy to orient yourself because you can see the ravine to descend. We will pass a water catchment on a stream that in almost all the maps appears as Vidular, we will continue to the following constructions (Ormías de Abajo) and soon another stream that is ours.

**Tour:** (machine translated)

The first part is sporty and very interesting, the second part is full of weeds that make it impossible to advance correctly. Perhaps it would be a good idea to take the scissors and clean up the riverbed together.

**Return:** (machine translated)

When the ravine begins to lose slope we find the last rappel and soon a milestone / milestone / milestone on the left orographic, we go out to take a path parallel to our stream and cross the same stream as in the access. We will continue parallel until we reach a track that we take to the left in ascending direction and leaves us on the access road.
