Summary: (machine translated)

South-facing forest canyon for "collectors", but with beautiful views of the Zugspitze massif. Worthwhile in the sunshine.

Hydrology:

Access: (machine translated)

From Garmisch-Partenkirchen on the B 23 towards Ehrwald. 2.3 km after the railroad crossing, the road crosses the Loisach. Immediately after the bridge, turn right into the parking lot and leave your car here.

Approach: (machine translated)

Above the parking lot, there is another small parking area directly in front of the railroad embankment. Carefully cross the tracks here and climb steeply up through the forest to a forest road. Follow the gravel road to the left. Two forest paths soon turn off to the right in a V-shape. Take the one on the left (this is also the way back). It leads straight on uphill through the forest and reaches a small, thinned-out section of forest. Here - before the wood pile on the edge of the path to the left (2017) - an inconspicuous path branches off to the right and then winds its way up the steep slope. Later, in flatter terrain, near the canyon, the view falls on a waterfall and soon afterwards the path joins a grassy path that leads to the entry on the left.

Tour: (machine translated)

Sequence of rappels - usually from trees - in open terrain. The high waterfall (48m) is rappelled via an intermediate belay (17m/30m). The anchor should have been on the left of the edge - but we didn't see it (2017). Instead, we rappel to the right into the chute (2x30m ropes are enough - barely) and then down from a fallen tree.

Depending on the water level and individual ability, up to 4 of the 8 abseiling points can also be downclimbed.

Return: (machine translated)

At the exit of the gorge, to the left along the foot of a rock face, a trail leads back to the approach path.

You can walk a beautiful canyon several times.... It had rained a lot recently. Due to the small catchment area of approx. 0.71 km², the water drains off relatively quickly and the tour was easy to do, even if there was a relatively large amount of water (for this canyon). Unfortunately, someone had removed all the fixed ropes and screw chain links that we had replaced in May. The now miserable equipment was problematic, especially with the high volume of water. We have set additional anchors to get down some (downclimbs) safely, but the existing anchors all need to be replaced. There are (if at all) only single bolts, but mostly only trees. We only left a fixed rope with a screw chain link hanging on 2 trees. Cloudy, without sun the canyon is less worthwhile. I recommend using the official parking lot and the official railroad crossing west of the Zieggraben. Access and return are only slightly longer. (machine translated)
