Summary: (machine translated) A canyon with an open morphology, either through the wooded areas or along the walls of the large waterfalls. A real treat for lovers of the great vertical.		
Hydrology: (machine translated) Not available most of the year. Take advantage of the thaw and rains in the spring and the days after the rains in the fall. Can be difficult to get right.		
Access:		
Approach: (machine translated) From Torla, continue on the road that leads to Puente de Los Navarros. On the right and a few meters before the bridge over the Barranco de Repetruso canyon, take the turnoff that leads to the La Glera bridge and the measuring station (park here, but remember that this point can also be reached on foot via the path that starts at the northern entrance of the road tunnel ditched under the village church). From the Puente de La Glera bridge, continue on foot along the Diazas forest path, leaving the Camino de Turieto on your left, just before the ascending bends of the path that lead you to the exit of the canyon. From here, the path continues in a very long straight line to SSE, where after 400 meters (250 meters after the exit of the Barranco del Lobo canyon) we find an obvious path on our left. This path leads us in numerous loops to the entrance of the canyon, after passing a repeat point, crossing the Barranco del Lobo canyon in its middle part and the tributary of the Barranco de Duáscaro (Barranco del Furicón) at its upper exit, as well as the "Bosque de Los Anfibios" (Amphibian Forest).		

Tour: (machine translated)

A canyon with an open morphology, either through the wooded areas or along the walls of the large waterfalls. A real treat for lovers of great verticals. From the entrance to the canyon, a first route leads through the "Bosque de Los Anfibios" (Amphibious Forest) with small ledges that can be climbed, where the first abseiling point is located, the "Cascada de Los Anfibios", to "La Rampa del Capi" as access to the waterfalls of "El Patio de Mi Padre", a semicircle with a spectacular drop of 120 meters, which is naturally divided into three abseiling points: "Cascada Helen", the fourth abseil ramp and the "Cascada María José" to reach the middle part of the descent. Back through the forest, the "Faja Superior" with its short abseils leads to a beautiful waterfall, the "Cascada Gloria", which with its 25 meters marks the descent to the "Faja Inferior" and its great abseil point "El Tubo de Machard Man". From here, the descent exits with some easy abseils.

Exits: numerous. Before abseiling point 2, hairpin bends through the forest back to the access path. From rappel 6, climb (with caution or with luck) through the wooded belts in a northerly direction to the fields of the Ribera del Río Ara.

Place name: Barranco de Duascaro. Duascaro de Morer canyon. It is often confused with its tributary, the Barranco de Furicón, as the Peña de Duáscaro is much further north.

Can be combined with the descent from: Barranco del Furco de Arán canyon and Garganta de Las Gloces del Río Jalle.

Return: (machine translated)

After the last abseiling point, continue along the riverbed until you reach the Diazas forest path at the bends mentioned above. From here you can walk back to the bridge of La Glera.
