**Summary:** (machine translated)

Small initiation dry canyon to complete the day after the ferrata of Ayna and practice guided rappel or diverters. Equipped by Javier and Cristina from AKAWI Sierra Del Segura.

**Hydrology:** (machine translated)

Yes, after the second rappel, past the arch of the water channel, we will ascend to the left returning to the Umbría trail.

**Access:** (machine translated)

We must arrive at Ayna for it we leave Albacete by the CM-3203 in direction Peñas de San Pedro until its intersection in Peñas de San Pedro with the CM-313 to again take the CM-3203 towards Alcaozo and after this continuing the road we will arrive at Ayna.  
Once in Ayna we will cross the town without leaving the CM-3203 road and we will leave towards Elche de la Sierra, at 1.5km we will find a bridge over the Mundo river on the left and an asphalted track that makes us return towards the town, we will follow it for 2.5 km downstream. We will arrive at an intersection where it is indicated, access to the town center on the left and on the right we will have a narrow alley that we will pass to find a space to park.

**Approach:** (machine translated)

The approach and return path are indicated with white and blue markings.  
From the parking lot we cross the bridge of the Alcudia, turn right following a path next to the disused irrigation ditch, we will find a few meters to the left a cobbled ramp indicating several local routes and the path of the Umbría. We will ascend this cobbled path until we reach the canal that feeds the hydroelectric plant of Hajar, here we leave the main road to take the path of the Umbría, following it we will reach the ruins of the Cortijo del Obispo. Here the path is lost a little, but turning to the right following the terraces of old almond trees and the marks, we find the path of the Umbría that leads us to see the channel again, we go down the winding "zetas" of the path until about 20 meters before reaching the channel we leave the path to enter the ravine and find the first headwaters.

### Tour:

Barranco corto, pero que da para practicar algunas maniobras de barranquismo, como el rapel guiado o desviadores para evitar roces. Al principio es mas abierto, los dos primeros rapeles son el calentamiento o para enseñar a gente sin experiencia. En el tercer rapel podemos evitar el roce que se genera haciendo un rapel guiado pues cuenta con instalación para ello, en el cuarto tenemos a mitad una repisa y un desviador por si queremos usarlo. Llegando al quinto rapel tenemos que dejar lo que seria el cauce por el lado izquierdo para pasar por detrás de una olivera, aquí encontramos un químico con anillas por si queremos asegurar nos para llegar a la cabecera del quinto rapel pues esta algo expuesto. Debajo de este rapel encontramos un paso a la izquierda de la vegetación con un par de destrepes sin mucha complicación, llegamos al sexto rapel enrampado y destrepable si tomamos ciertas precauciones, nos lleva asta la última cabecera séptimo rapel que podríamos saltarnos si tenemos suficiente cuerda y la usamos de desviador y si no, aquí tenemos espacio para 4 o 5 personas y realizar el ultimo rapel, en este tenemos vegetación en la pared que nos impide ver algunos agujeros tomad precauciones.

### Return: (machine translated)

After the last rappel we will exit to the north leaving the big walls to our left, we follow a path marked with blue and white paint next to the disused irrigation ditch that leads us to find the Alcuia bridge.


