Aquatic canyon, for collectors or beginners, with 4 rappels that can be jumped if there is enough water and without great difficulties. It has a couple of caves / caves that have their interest.

By the CM210 that goes from Molina de Aragón almost to Cuenca, crossing the Alto Tajo in an area of great ecological value. When we get to Beteta we turn off towards Masegosa on the CM-2201 and follow it until we reach the Peralejos de las Truchas turnoff CM-2106 (turn left).

On the road to Peralejos we will reach the bridge over the river Tajo (Martinete bridge), take the track that goes to the left, just across the bridge and after a kilometer we will have room to park in the area used by bathers or a little further on.

With the access car we return to the road undoing part of the road until p.k. 84. 84, in the curve there we will find a panel with the GR that runs through the ravine. We park here.

Approach: (machine translated)

We will leave by the track towards the hill following the indications of the ravine, we will go down the same track until it reaches the stream, at which point the GR turns right to get into the narrows, a few meters below, the trail approaches the stream, time to access.

Very simple, almost a water hiking, in which we can equip a couple of steps. If we do not want we can avoid them. Highly recommended the caves

We will arrive at the Tajo, we can cross it and go up to the track where we have parked.
