Summary: (machine translated)

Nice ravine in spring and after rains, it has a first part too grassy that tarnishes it but then it is worth it. The return is made by the river almost up to the power station, with beautiful pools.

Perfectly equipped, even for high flows, it allows to make practices and to use it of initiation with the suitable flow. Although some sites talk about 1.5 hours of approach, it is possible to combine cars and reduce it to half an hour.

Access: (machine translated)

Take the N123 to Campo, follow it towards Castejón de Sos.

Arriving at pk 402 we have the detour to the left to Viu and Senz. After 100m we have on the right (in a left fork of the road) a track that goes to the power station, we drive another 100m before the bridge and park in the small hole there. If there is no place we leave the car in the detour.

With the access car, if we have it, we will go up the road to Senz, in the left curve, with a warehouse on the right, a track that goes down to our ravine, we park here.

Approach: (machine translated)

With two cars the access is very fast, we will go down the track and when it is lost we only have to continue straight ahead towards the riverbed, already very clear.

With only one car, we go down the bridge by the orographic right to take the path PR-HU-120, cross the river, the Aigüeta de Viu, and follow the path, with PR marks for just over 1km to a turn of the river, shortly after, see a concrete bridge that we will cross. We will go gently up the slope to head south in search of our stream.

Tour: (machine translated)

Fat and enjoyable if we find it with the right flow, with very aesthetic areas. A pity that it is so short

Return: (machine translated)

Arriving at the Aigüeta the ravine ends, we will continue along it doing the typical trekking through crystal clear water pools, where we can swim if the day is fine.

We will arrive at the aforementioned PR, here we will exit to the right to go up to the bridge.
