Summary: (machine translated)

Forest canyon with several walking and downclimbs, but also some higher rappels from 5m to 38m. Some abseils can also be completed over trees. It may also be possible to make 3 smaller jumps if the pools are not too graveled.

Hydrology: (machine translated)

It is a ditch with rather little water, but should not be underestimated, especially in a few places after heavy rain.

Access: (machine translated)

We drive from Oberaudorf in the direction of Flinsbach. Approx. 500m before the Kirnsteiner-Hof, there is a parking lot on the right-hand side next to a small lake. We can park our car here free of charge.

Approach: (machine translated)

From the parking lot, cross the road and follow the forest road up the mountain. At the first junction near the house, we follow the left-hand path until we come to another junction, where we continue to the right. After the bends around your high rappel, which leads over another stream, we enter the stream just above the waterfall.

Tour: (machine translated)

This is a tour in rather open terrain, but with short parts that are cut a little deep. The highlight is the highest rappel at 38m and the sometimes quite dark rock with quartz, which runs through the rock in veins. Due to the heavy thunderstorm at the beginning of June 2024, some trees in the lower part of the canyon slid into the stream.

Return: (machine translated)

After the last rappel we walk about 700m in the stream until we see a small trail on the right, about 100m before a small reservoir, which we follow to our car along the slope.

Only had to rappel once from a tree, otherwise expansion anchors were available or we downclimbed. Partly brittle scales, otherwise non-slip rock with good grip. Mosquito invasion on the way back (machine translated)

We placed new expansion bolts on the first (32er), the third (10er) and after the 38er on the left side of a 15er. The rock was grippy, but all the pools were gravel and nothing could be jumped. On the exit, the trees were mostly cleared away by the forestry machines. (machine translated)
