**Summary:** (machine translated)

Dry canyon, simple and quick to descend, perfect to combine with others in the area, on the north side of the shady slope, so there is plenty of vegetation, both in the approach and along the route, facilities at hand and affordable skills make it a good canyon for beginners.

**Hydrology:** (machine translated)

Both R1 and R2 are returnable by climbing, the latter perhaps using some material to secure.

**Access:** (machine translated)

By the RM-414 we take direction Barriada de las Cosasbuenas, there is no previous signposting until we arrive. Once we enter Cosasbuenos we will go to the left and then go up a dirt road until we reach the end near the foot of the mountain, on our left we leave an irrigation pond.

Caution: There is a bee farm, we can leave the car a little further down without problem.

**Approach:** (machine translated)

We follow the natural course of the wadi until it narrows and forks in two, we head towards the valley on our right, there is abundant presence of vegetation, including brambles, the climb becomes many steps in loose boulder scree, but without any exposure, along the way we find the occasional milestone. Once we have taken some height, we will see that the riverbed leads us to the left slope, after a small and easy climb, we reach the top of the ridge that divides the ravine. From the top of the ridge looking north, we cross to the orographic left of the ravine that we are going to descend (our right). Once there, with a slight slope, we find ourselves in the riverbed and a few meters ahead the first meeting.

**Tour:** (machine translated)

After the first rapell we have a natural handrail, it could be avoidable because the access to the second meeting can be done safely, although it never hurts to practice, the third rapell is the longest, with 26 meters high, at the beginning of the rapell we find a palm tree through which it is advisable not to pass the rope. From the third rapell to the fifth, there is a succession of short sections, the fourth rapell meeting is in the middle, avoidable.

The ravine ends where we take the bifurcation for the approach, you can't get lost.

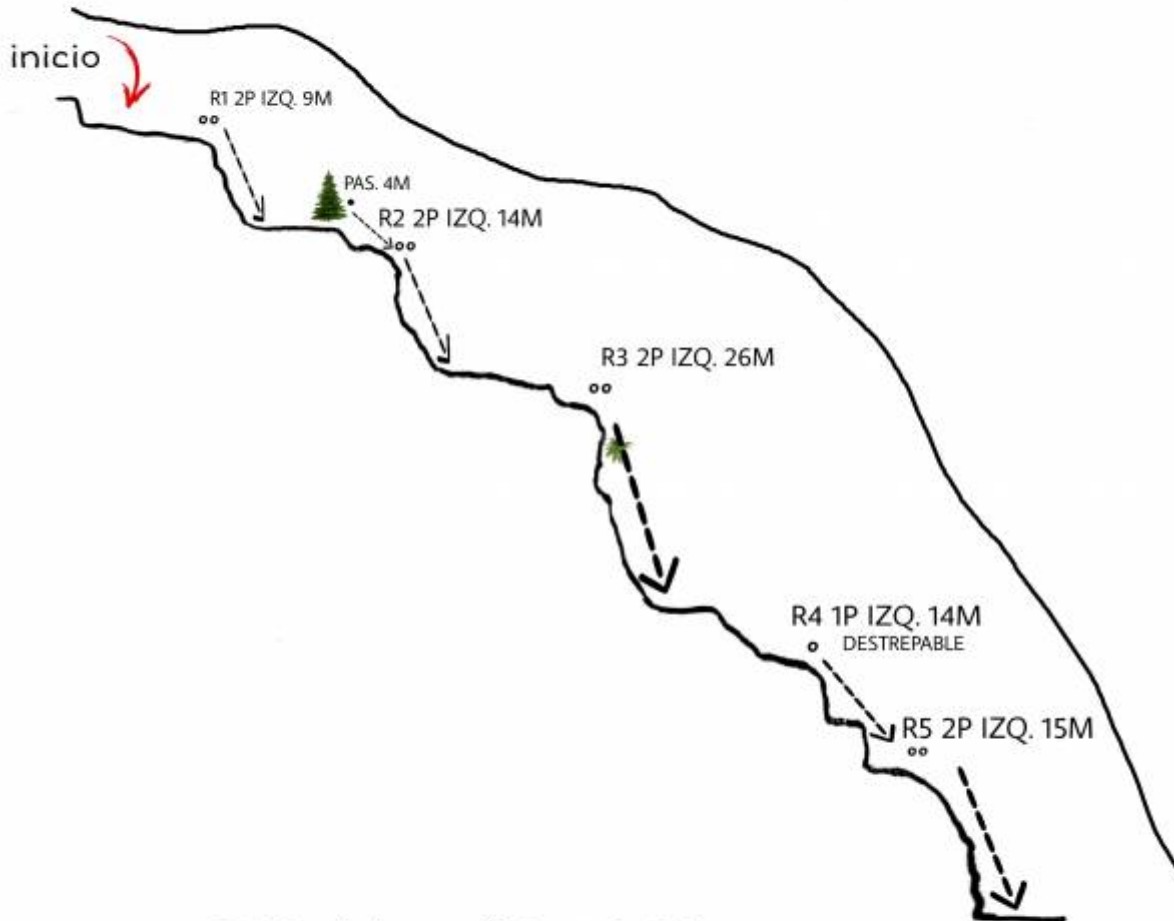
