Summary: (machine translated) A descent, usually dry, located in the middle of Camero Nuevo, which flows into the Iregua River.		
Hydrology: (machine translated) Before and after the embedded areas.		
Access: (machine translated) OpenStreetMap (OSM) cartography. Exit parking on the other side of the Iregua River, on the N-111. From Logroño we will take the N-111 towards Soria; we leave on the right the crossing that goes up to Nieva de Cameros; we continue along the N-111 for a little more than 800 m; on the left we will see a wide clearing from which a road comes out, where we will leave the exit vehicle. Parking lot to access the lower section. From Logroño we take the N-111 towards Soria; past Torrecilla de Cameros we take the LR-253 towards Almarza. After a couple of bends we will see on the right an abandoned farm, and the stakes that indicate a stage of the Roman path of Iregua; we will leave a car here. Parking access to the upper section. From Logroño we will take the N-111 towards Soria; past Torrecilla de Cameros we take the LR-253 towards Almarza. Then we will take the LR-453 to Pinillos; a few meters before km 2, we will find a lay-by on the right, where we can park.		
Approach: (machine translated) OpenStreetMap (OSM) Mapping Lower part Follow the Roman Way trail, cross the bridge over the Admuel stream and follow the path to the next bridge, which crosses the Rio Seco. Upper part We follow a diffuse path towards the SW, which directs us towards the ravine; we advance with the same orientation, descending through the forest, along the most obvious paths, until we reach the riverbed.		

Tour: (machine translated)

For less than 600 m the riverbed does not offer anything to highlight; some marmitas begin to appear interspersed by some short projections. Generally, everything will be dry. Afterwards, we arrive at another 4-meter high bank that leads to a marmita with a certain depth; then there are more high banks. We advance for about 1 km between walking and small ledges; we arrive at the bridge that crosses the ravine by the Senda Romana del Iregua. We continue along the riverbed and, quickly, there are two 3-meter long, climbable ledges; we reach an R10 with water at its base; we continue for a few meters, some ledges with water, avoidable; a corridor with water connects with the Iregua River, where the descent ends.

Cross the Iregua River; take a path to the left that connects with a wider path, which we will follow uphill to the exit parking lot.
