Summary: (machine translated) Some really high waterfalls.		
Hydrology: (machine translated) Water catchment before the last 3 rappels.		
Access:		
Approach: (machine translated) Take the Diegisbalm self-service cable car to the middle station (first stop). From there, follow the road on foot to the left along the dirt track to the stream.		
Tour: (machine translated) Before that, there is always more water due to tributaries, but with little influence on the seriousness. The crux has no more water than you see at the start. The crux is an intermediate pool after 10 meters of rappel in a narrow chute. The pool is relatively small and turns even at normal water levels. The first climber must be belayed to the edge of the pool to get to the double belay for the following high rappel. Before the highest rappel into the collector, there is an intermediate stand after approx. 5 meters directly below the edge. From there it is about 20 meters along the rock and then 50 meters free hanging. Water catchment before the last 3 rappels.		
Return: (machine translated) After the last rappel, climb out of the stream to the right and back to the road. From there, turn left back to the car.

All anchors ok, but you have to search a bit. Below the C70 the anchors are RD behind a large block (not rg as in the topographic view). Very rewarding canyon! Don't be fooled by the amount of water you see from the valley (see pictures). The last 3 rappels are below the socket and it looks like very little. The water level at the top is okay. Take 6 CHF for the cable car or Twint. (machine translated)
