Location of San Felipe ravines

Parking at the top, on the GC291, in the p.k 6.9 in the curve, we have the exit for the path of San Felipe. We get into this track and park.

If we want to park at the bottom we will go to San Felipe by the GC751 until the end.

Access bcos Valerón, Calabozo, Silva and Guayarmina

From the top it is very easy to park and follow the track until it ends, then the San Felipe trail goes to the right through the tunnels. We will go down the ravine to pass under the highway bridge, where the R1 is located.

From below by the street Diseminado de San Felipe we approach the base of the bridge of the freeway, arriving we will find a path on the right "Camino de San Felipe" where we will go up until we pass the last tunnel of GC2 towards Galdar. Here we will take the path to the right towards the bridge.
