On the north face of the Taillon and the Gabietos, from the melting glacier of the latter is born a modest but entertaining canyon to do in half a day. It can be combined directly with Tourettes.

To bear in mind, very cold water all year round.

Access: (machine translated)

From Tarbes we head towards Lourdes on the N21. Then we continue towards Gavarnie-Gedre on the D821. Continue towards Gavarnie-Gedre on the D921 to Gédre and from here to Gavarnie. Almost at the entrance of the village we have a detour to the right towards the slopes. We take it, go up to the slopes and park at the Col de Tentes.

Approach: (machine translated)

Equipped we climb the col de Boucharo (or port of Bujaruelo) and towards the refuge of Sarradets. Crossing the stream of the Gabietos glacier we turn off along its course. Soon the descent begins.

Tour: (machine translated)

A first area of ledges and slides that can be dodged up to the embedded area where we have the access rappels to the abseil of the waterfall.

Once at the bottom of the "vallon de Pouey Aspé" we turn left to go up to the col de Boucharo. Another option is to turn right towards the Cabanne de soldats and soon we find the Tourettes gorge.
