Van den Berge starts on the northern side of the forebay, which seems suboptimal compared to the route suggested here.

## **Approach:** (machine translated)

From the car on the road back to the bridge. Get in there.

Since the first 3 drops were not secured, I suspect that you can descend directly from the edge of the excavation site into the pot before the last step, or even rappel. This would save you the unpleasant part.

## **Tour:** (machine translated)

The first two steps are just as unprotected as the 3rd step. Only the final abseil offers a sling. Up to the final abseil, the forest canyon is muddy and without any interest. Directly above the final abseil the ambience becomes attractive. The last rappel leads down into a usually open siphon. At high water it will usually be dammed up, which is why van den Berge warns against this situation in his book. A little later you reach the picnic area with spring and connection to the hiking trail.

**Return:** (machine translated)

Over the footbridge and up the path to the excavation site where the car is parked.
