Short but impressive canyon with large pools, known for its final waterfall, behind which you can walk along a tourist trail. Please call the hydroelectric plant to make sure they are not releasing water from the dam.

**Hydrology:** (machine translated)

Generally carries a lot of water, the pools are large and some whitewater experience is an advantage.

Access: (machine translated)

Park at the Roflaschlucht inn. Either walk from here or drive up by car.

**Approach:** (machine translated)

Straight down into the stream by the car.

Tour: (machine translated)

Everything can be slid and jumped. Before the last step, be careful when crossing the stream so as not to be swept over the edge if there is a lot of water. On the left, a chain on a tree can be used to rappel down to the visitor's gallery, but there is a large waterfall below if there is a lot of water. At the top right is a ring bolt, from which 15m down to the right is another ring bolt, 15m rappel or 5m rappel and jump.

Return: (machine translated)

Do not get off at the visitors' gallery!

Continue along the stream and back up by the lake to the parking lot.

There was already considerably more water than in the photos here. With a little whitewater experience, however, it's doable. Cool slide and various jumps doable. We only needed the ropes for the two drops at the end. However, these can probably also be jumped when the water is at a depth. We drilled a bolt around the corner at the last ledge so that you can rappel outside the water when the water level is high. The ledge was too deep under water to jump from. (machine translated)

I started from the highway service station (the gate was unlocked). From there it was a steep, pathless walk to the open stream in just a few minutes. You immediately realize that this is a canyon with a lot of water. I climbed around all the first sections until the first jump (orographic right 1 bolt) The rest of the canyon should always be approached with caution, bearing in mind the very strong currents, and jumps should always be targeted. There are always opportunities for emergency exits At the last large waterfall, do not be confused by the individual bolts in the middle or on the right. A chain anchor at the top left of the tree From there down to Nase. Here you come directly to the hiking trail. I deliberately jumped into the strong waterfall on the left, but this is only safe for experienced whitewater rafters. Otherwise go around and jump to the right outside the current. Copied from RopeWiki: It starts with an open waterfall. An anchor is on the right, but from the big boulder on the left, it should be possible to jump into the small pool (6-7m). After 50m-100m of walking comes the most continuous section of the canyon. Downclimb 3-4m. Then comes a small rappel, you can also climb up on the right and jump from 8m. Next is a 10m-12m drop where you can slide down. After another 50m-100m is a flat narrow waterfall. Rappel halfway down on the right, and then slide or jump into the pool behind the whitewater. To finish off, you'll find a 5m drop followed by the final Waterfall. Both can be jumped, but on the last one you'll need to reach the little nose in between the two water jets. 40m ropes are enough (machine translated)
