Summary: (machine translated) Among the ravines of the river Hias, Fuente el Haya, Somo, Río Salto and Pasada Mala del Portillo de Ataxa, we find this mastodon, with an approach to its upper part without a path but among beautiful beech forests and green pastures on the summits of the cirque. An open upper part and very long rappels, will give way to a lower part that will join the rest of the ravines, thus increasing the murmur of the waters that will take us to the magnificent helical waterfall. It is better to do it in spring or after rains, anyway the most interesting part and that the companies do is entering by the Salto river in its lower part. In case you want to do the upper part of the canyon, bring equipment material because the facilities are in poor condition or nonexistent!		
Hydrology: (machine translated) In many areas along the hillside, or on any of the trails that cross it.		
Access: (machine translated) From Amurrio to Balmaseda on the A624, at km 44 or 45 take the turn-off to Izoria and Maroño. We will go up to the Maroño reservoir and continue to Aguiñiga where we will park.		
Approach: (machine translated) We have to leave through the beech forest, which we leave behind to take the path that goes from Lendoño to Portillo de Menérdiga, shortly before reaching the Portillo, under the walls that close the cirque, we leave the path to go to the right without losing height in search of the upwelling and our riverbed. Another option is by the access path to Salto or Somo, we leave behind the head of Somo and continue to Fuente el Haya, here we can begin to descend the ravine or follow the path to also go to the path that climbs to Portillo.		
Tour: (machine translated) First part vertical and long rappels, then the canyon is losing height but gaining flow with the contributions of the Salto and Pasada Mala canyon, at which point we reach the most spectacular rapel.		
Return: (machine translated) After this rapel we can leave by the track that crosses us or continue doing 2 more rappels to go to the part of the meanders, magical area and leave by the bridge next to the village.

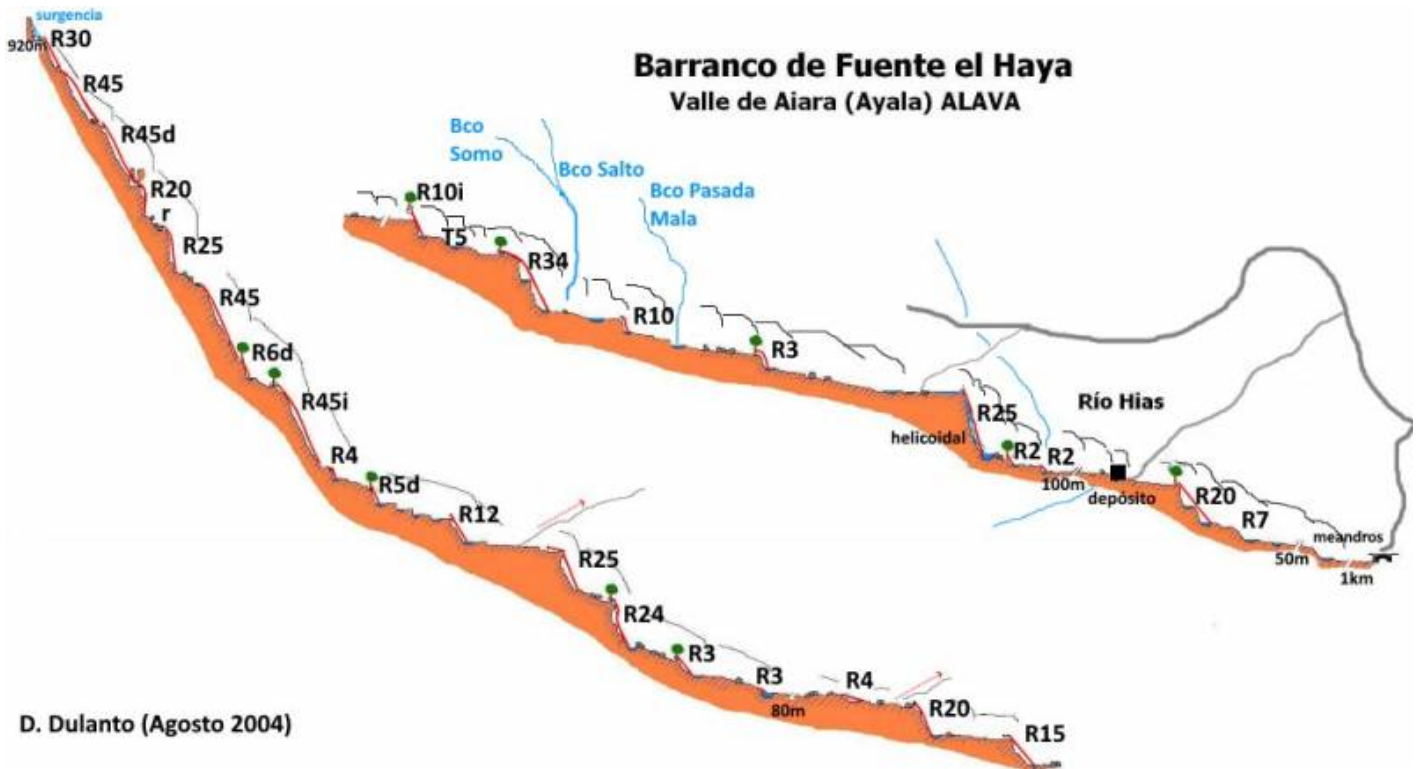
