Summary: (machine translated)

Generally dry ravine of the Gabarri basin, aesthetic, entertaining and very important to take into account after rains to find the pools with water. Perfect to combine with Gabarri. Its negative side is the loss of its access and the little water it usually carries.

Peculiar descent in the north of Zaragoza, close to Huesca and Navarra, and with the Pyrenees in the background.

Access: (machine translated)

We will have to be located near Lorbés.

On the A21/N240 between Pamplona and Jaca, we will take the A137 towards Sigüés and Salvatierra. We will leave the first one behind and when we arrive to Salvatierra, in the curve that makes the road, to the left, inside the town, we will find the detour to Lorbés to the right (12km).

Along this road we will go for 7kms until almost crossing the river Gabarri, here we will find a track on the left that in north direction goes, by the orographic right of our river, until almost the headwaters. It is about 4kms of track until before the left fork.

Approach: (machine translated)

Access bcos Gabarri

We will leave following the river, south direction, towards an old borda, we go around it and take a small path that starts behind it.

Access to the Paco Chacobo, Paco Leala and Gabarri banks.

This small path, losing in many moments, raises us above the valley, to go heading north towards the bed of Paco Leala, after a turn to the right we change from the mountain and we will see the long waterfall of Paco Leala. We will continue the ascent gently with the waterfall on the left, surrounding this small cirque and surpassing it until we reach the riverbed, we cross it and we head to surpass the next spur.

From here we already intuit the complete route to descend, we will continue without losing height until we reach the riverbed.

Some reviews indicate the possibility of climbing directly up the left slope (orographic of the stream) from the Gabarri to the headwaters.

Tour: (machine translated)

Several waterfalls to be descended and a multitude of skills up to the Gabarri riverbed.

We will follow the riverbed until we reach Gabarri and from here to the south following the path to the track.
