From Villalba de la Sierra towards Uña, about 2 km before reaching the Mirador del Ventano del Diablo, on the left side there is a track of about 300m that leads to the parking lot where you must request permission in:

DO NOT PARK AT THE MIRADOR DEL VENTANO DEL DIABLO, parking time is restricted to 30 min.

Approach: (machine translated)

At the end of the parking lot, we go through the tunnel (conduit of water pipes) continue the path, we will have to pass up to 3 tunnels, after the last tunnel, about 150 m we find on the left the entrance to the ravine, This path teine some iron steps and pegs in the ground.

It is advisable to wear a headlamp to pass the tunnels for comfort and safety.

Tour: (machine translated)

It begins in an area with little current, a few meters we will have the first slides that go down the main vein of the river.

This will take us to the chaos of blocks, in the right margin we have the washing machine, (slide with rebufo) and point of danger of the descent. Being this avoidable by the left side, if it is not wanted to be carried out).

Then it leaves us in the vicinity of the waterfall where we will avoid it by the left margin, with the only obligatory jump of the whole descent.

Once saved the waterfall on the right bank we will have to leave the riverbed to look for the jumps.

The final section of the ravine is a narrow stretch where the water will drag us to the Tranco de las Olas, a large swimming hole where there are iron pins on the right side that will give us access to the last and highest jumps of the route.

Return: (machine translated)

From Tranco de las Olas, on the left side of the ravine we take a path that will lead us to the access road, and thus retrace the path we made on the approach.


