Summary: (machine translated) The long rappel canyon is mostly open and offers a beautiful view, apart from two narrow passages. It is almost uninterrupted, with the exception of 1-2 short walking passages. The several abseiling points vary between 5 and 20 meters. With a 2 x 30 meter rope or a 1 x 60 meter rope, you can often rappel two parts in one go		
Hydrology: (machine translated) The catchment area is relatively manageable. There is always some water, but you could enter shortly after a rainy period. Nevertheless, there is a lot of driftwood and gravel along the stream, which indicates high water levels. Beware of thunderstorms!		
Access: (machine translated) From Weißenbach on the B311 (Pinzgauer Str.) in the direction of Saalfelden. Pass Hotel Brandlhof and after approx. 2 km turn left to the Stoissengraben parking lot.		
Approach: (machine translated) From the Stoissengraben parking lot, follow the cycle path for about 200 meters in the direction of Weißbach. Cross the B311 and follow the forest path that starts in front of the Stoissenbauern. After crossing the Mühlbach stream, the path begins on the left bank (orographic north). Caution: After about 900 meters, at the last hairpin bend and a crossroads, do not follow the better developed path that leads north, but keep left. Follow the path further up to about 1050 meters and enter above the confluence of the main tributary (orographic southwest).		
Tour: (machine translated) The Mühlbach was used for the first time at the exit of August 2024 as part of a canyoning rescue exercise. The canyon has more than 20 steps/waterfalls. About 14 single hooks were installed and some tree slings, but a few small waterfalls were bypassed or double rappelled (two steps from a stand). It is therefore necessary to bring additional equipment! This is a beautiful abseil gorge that is almost uninterrupted. It is very scenic. There are a few small slides, but there is no big highlight. Nevertheless, the tour is definitely worthwhile. The canyon was filled with boulders, but under different conditions there might be several pools where you could jump or slide.		
Return: (machine translated) After the last waterfall, walk along the streambed for about 5 minutes until you reach a forest path on the right bank. Then walk back the same way as the ascent.
