The descent consists of small indentations with many small obstacles, including numerous slides and jumps of up to 10 m in height. There are several natural arches. You can easily get out between the individual indentations and find your way back.

After the indentation below the chalets of Hinterbalm, you have to take the path to the right again to bypass a 200 m high boulder pile and reach the last waterfalls.

In a final gulch, you line up 6 abseils from 15 to 60 meters. The waterfalls are nice, with depths, geysers... Three more small slides and the descent is done!

Apart from the redemption of the last stunts, you can get out of the redemptions very regularly.

Aquatic:

The canyon is fed by 2 glaciers and a large watershed, so wait for the cool temperatures of fall to consider the descent.

Be sure to bring your climbing gear:

First time gear to add, we did a lot of de-escalating, jumping (up to 8-10 meters) or sliding without setting a point at certain obstacles.
