Drive up the Queyras valley to La Maison du Roy. Cross the Guil at the reservoir and park just after the bridge. The shuttle bus is possible but very long and not really interesting: from Mont-Dauphin (train station), head towards Eygliers, pass the village and follow the direction of Gros. In the hamlet, take the path to the left to its exit.

### Approach:

(machine translated)  
From the bridge over the Guil, follow the well-marked path (signpost to Furfande) that goes uphill until you come to a road after about 40 minutes. Follow it to the right until its exit (parking lot for the shuttle bus) and then continue on the wide path that goes downhill until it crosses the river, at the level of the remains of the bridge that was swept away by a flood a few years ago.

Strong, there are virtually no loopholes.

**Period/ water character**

To be done at the time of snowmelt to take advantage of a good water flow, or after a rainy period. The water level is visible at the arrival of the torrent.

The descent would be more interesting if there weren't so many steps between the obstacles and especially the beautiful waterfalls at the exit.

There is almost no water in August.

The canyon is hardly ever used and the equipment regularly suffers from high water and rockfall.
